

Lois N. Epstein, P.E. is currently the Arctic Program Director for the Wilderness Society. Previously she worked as the Director of the Alaska Transportation Priorities Project in Anchorage from 2007 - 2010, and also worked for Cook Inlet Keeper as a Senior Engineer and an Oil and Gas Industry Specialist from 2001 - 2006. Before her time in Alaska she worked for Environmental Defense (formerly Environmental Defense Fund) in Washington, D.C. on pollution prevention and measuring industrial environmental performance. Prior to these positions, Lois worked for two private consulting firms and the U.S. EPA Region 9 Office of Water. She has presented invited testimony before the U.S. Congress on nine occasions. Lois is a licensed Professional Engineer in the States of Alaska and Maryland and previously served as a member of the federal Office of Pipeline Safety's advisory committee on hazardous liquid pipelines. She has a masters degree from Stanford University in Civil Engineering with a specialization in environmental engineering and science, and undergraduate degrees from both Amherst College (in English) and MIT (in mechanical engineering).
